Playground Rules (original from installation by International Play Co.)

1. ~~Use of this equipment should be by the intended age group.~~ (Replaced 06 2012 with :) Use of this playground is for children 12 years old and under and their parents\guardians only.
2. Use each play event as it is intended. Improper use of this equipment may result in serious injury.
3. Use playground equipment only if safety surfacing is installed beneath and around the equipment. Without a proper safety surface the playground must be considered unsafe for play activities.
4. Immediately report any safety concerns or broken, damaged or vandalized parts to the playground owner.
5. Stay away from metal surfaces that have been in direct sunlight as they may be hot. Serious thermal burns may result when bare skin comes in contact with hot metal.
6. Adult supervisors must keep all children playing safely.
7. Always use playground equipment safely.
- A. Use slides only in a safe-seated position. Never climb "UP". Exit promptly to avoid collisions.
- B. Do not ride bicycles, skate boards, roller blades or skates on playground equipment.
- C. Never wear a helmet, backpack, or clothing with strings while using playground equipment.
- D. Do not climb over or on the outside of any barrier wall.
- E. Never run or push while on the playground equipment.
- F. Do not use playground equipment when wet or slippery with ice or snow.
